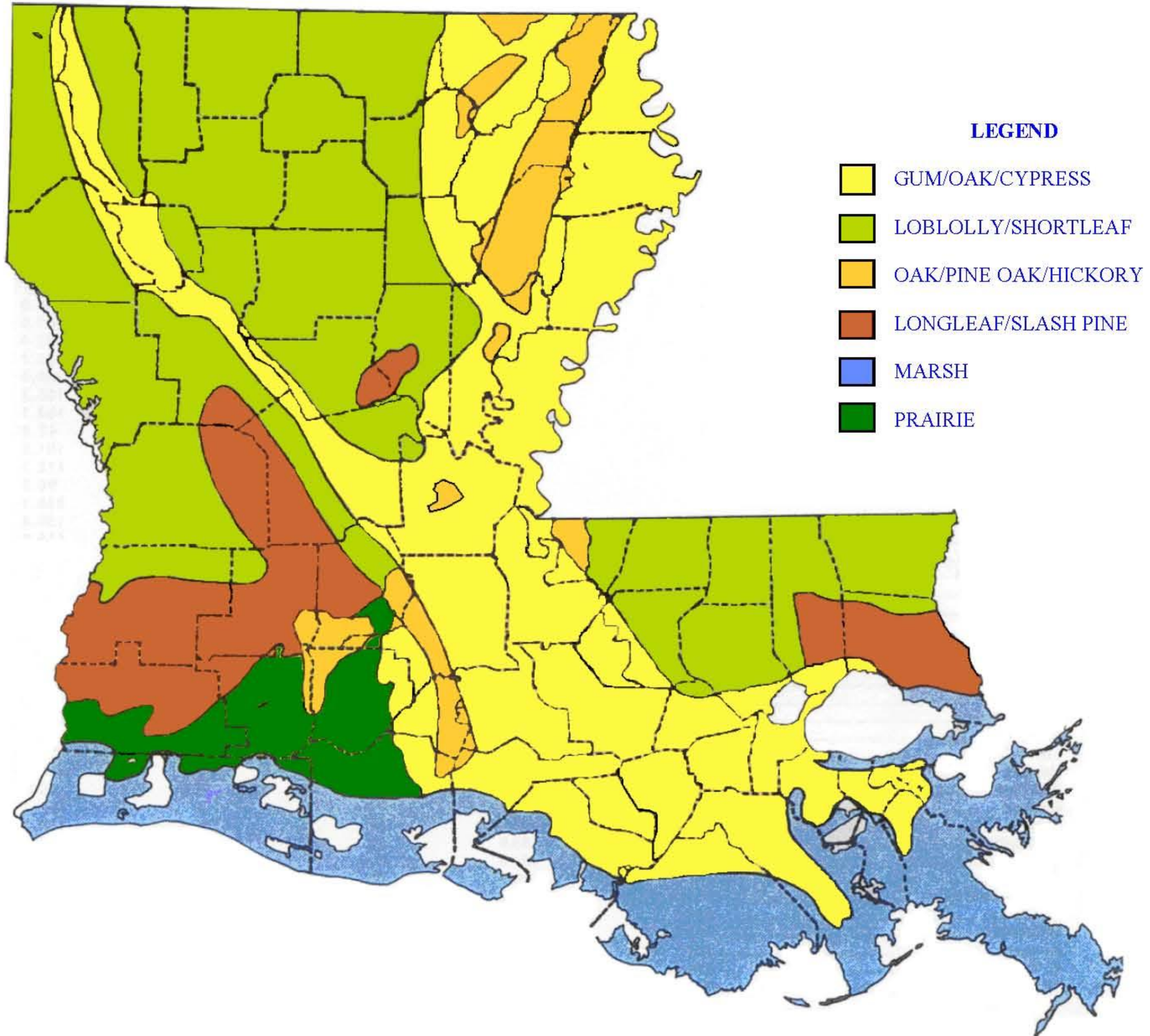


LOUISIANA FOREST TYPES
